The Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds will probably be in San Diego Friday or Saturday next. As soon as the itinerary is made I will inform you as to the date. I have written to Dr. Gochnauer, and suggested that he see you and arrange what entertainment you think necessary. I suppose the time will be short, and probably they will have no time for anything other than the business they go on. Whatever has been the custom in the past will be sufficient. There is a good chance of getting all we want. I do not mean to hold out to much hope, but I have been able to get an expression from a number of the members, and they are very favorably inclined to give me what I want. Our only fear now is the Governor. Appropriations are going to be very large, and some will have to be cut out; in fact a great many, but ours stands as good a show as any, and the Governor is certainly a friend to San Diego, as he has repeatedly told me.
