SUBJECT: Replacement of one full-time instructional position

Upon consultation with Vice President Walker, Dean Kochanski, and the Faculty Advisory Committee for Women's Studies, one instructional position is being allocated to the Women's Studies Program to replace the Distinguished Visiting Professorship which the program enjoyed in the 1970-71 academic year.

The reason for this allocation is to strengthen the Women's Studies Program and to enable it to progress towards the academic quality it must maintain in this university. To this end three stipulations are added, namely, that the Women's Studies Board fill the position with a person comparable in academic standing and qualifications to Dr. Roberta Salper, current recipient of the Distinguished Visiting Professorship; that this person be recruited from outside this institution and be offered a full-time position on the tenure track; and that the members of the advisory committee and I participate in interviewing prospective candidates.

Beginning with the academic year 1971-72, therefore, the Women's Studies Program will have as its instructional position base 2.50 positions.
