Dear Sir:-

Your letter of October second, received this morning, comes as a complete surprise to me.

My recollection of the matter is that owing to some delay occasionally, regarding the notification of receipt of money by the bank at Sacramento, you kindly accommodated the teachers by cashing their salary checks. It is also very strongly impressed upon my recollection that afterwards you made that a permanent arrangement, authorizing us to draw just as soon as we were notified by the Sacramento authorities that our bills had been allowed. If I had not been under this impression I can assure you that we would never have presumed to draw upon you.
