Purpose

The first complete Women's Studies Program to be developed in the United States is offering courses this fall (1970) at San Diego State College. It is an attempt to repair the damage done to women by the omissions and distortions of traditional education and to illustrate at least one way of releasing the power and potential of more than half the population of this country.

History

Last October, women from the campus Women's Liberation group, in co-operation with faculty and community women, formed the Ad Hoc Committee for Women's Studies. The efforts of that committee culminated in the Women's Studies Program described below.

Program Description

The Women's Studies curriculum focuses on questions, issues, and problems that require unique definitions and analyses. It is, therefore, interdisciplinary yet autonomous, existing as a separate entity within the College of Arts and Letters. Furthermore, since it offers a group of upper division electives (see box below), its main value, unlike that of a major, is to create an awareness that could not be gained through the pursuit of any one major.

Learning Environment

The Women's Studies Program will provide an educational environment in which students will have the freedom to initiate their own learning and to confront the issues that are relevant to their lives.

The Vision of the Women's Studies Committee

We feel that San Diego State College has the potential to develop a major center of study, services, and research. We are determined to do this. Our excitement and determination are strengthened by the realization that our work will greatly facilitate and support the efforts of our sisters in the nationwide women's movement.
