

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS

The Committee on Nominations is composed of six ruling elders and six ministers in three classes of four members each, serving a term of three years. No person who shall have served a full term of three years shall be eligible for reappointment to the Committee or for election to the General Council or any commission, committee, board or agency of the Church for which the Committee shall have submitted nominations, until two years have elapsed since the expiration of his term of office.

It is the responsibility of the Committee to receive and consider recommendations for membership on the boards and agencies of the Church and to submit its report on nominations to the General Assembly. Recommendations for nominations are solicited through articles in Presbyterian Life and Monday Morning, letters to the stated clerks and executives of synods and presbyteries, and in other ways. The Committee is grateful to judicatories and individuals for their response. Each name submitted is checked by the Committee, and referred to the board or agency for study and comment.

We are impressed by the number of able and consecrated leaders available within the Church. It is not possible in any one year to use all of the names submitted. Names of persons not nominated are placed in the file and kept under review for five years, or until they are elected, or for some reason become ineligible for further consideration. It is hoped that additional endorsements will be submitted if new information should be brought to the attention of the Committee.

The Committee works throughout the year. The executive committee meets in October with representatives of the boards and agencies, at the time and place of the General Council meeting. The entire committee meets in March to prepare tentative lists of nominations. Again, two days before the opening of General Assembly, and during the first three days of the General Assembly, the entire committee meets to make final decisions. Open hearings, to which anyone may come, are held the first two days of the General Assembly.

We believe that our first duty is to find the best possible leadership for the Church, taking into account such factors as geographical distribution, proportion among ministers, laymen, and women, tenure in office, skills and experience needed.

We respectfully submit to the General Assembly the unanimous report of our committee.
