SOME CHURCH SIGNBOARDS are as impersonal as a time table. But on many of them there is a personal message that says:

THIS CHURCH IS OPEN, ENTER, REST AND PRAY

OPEN. From dawn to dark, the door is on the jar. You need no key. You need not ask permission. Most doors are locked. Usually you have to state your business. But not here.

ENTER. Your welcome is not from the church officials. Much more, it is Christ's welcome. "Whoever will may come."

REST. The Church knows how people need rest. A place for a tired or troubled one to sit down and rest. A place of quiet. Rest from the mind's uneasiness, the soul's weariness. Come in and find rest.

PRAY: Here in the dim quiet the peace of God begins to fall upon your soul, and the driven heart beats more slowly. There is nothing you may not talk over with your Heavenly Father; no problem or burden that you may not lay before Him. He has a marvelous way of solving problems, straightening tangles, meeting needs, and giving comfort, strength and hope. You are assured of a hearing because it is a loving Father who invites you to open your heart to Him.

STUDENTS FROM SEVEN COUNTRIES and nine U.S. states are enrolled at national missions Menaul School in Albuquerque, New Mexico, this year. Founded in 1881 and long an educational center for Spanish American young people, the school this year has students from states from Alaska to Louisiana and from North Borneo, Thailand, Dominican Republic, Honduras, Mexico, and Korea.
