I know I have been negligent about writing as I should but I can plead a good excuse. I am home from one of the worst cases I ever took care of. We were out in a tent away from every possible convenience and even when the man was in such a loathsome state it was far from pleasant. He died last evening from tuberculosis. The heat in the tent in the daytime and the cold at night and also the long hours with—

out rest made me ill. Yesterday
I was unable to retain any thing on
my stomach and today I feel weak
in the knees, but I shall be alright
now that I am home and can get
some rest and proper food.

Wife I would like to send you
some money but I am just
making expenses and have on
June 1st paid my yearly payment
on my insurance, which is quite
a little.

I am glad the children have
done so well in school and hope
they have a good time this
vacation.

I suppose Mr. Jursweiler will
be looking for a third wife now,
poor woman whoever she is.

I still like Prescott and
think for the present I shall re-
main here. No Jaccanin there
is no swimming pool here and
water is not plentiful even for
household use unless you have
plenty of money to pay for it.
It costs from \$5.00 to \$20.00 per
month.

Mrs. Thomas the lady I room
and board with is one of the best

women to get along with
I've ever had experience with.
She keeps her house immaculate
and is a splendid cook. We
have eleven boarders and
four roomers.

Mother if you care to and can
make use of that gray and the
black dresses of mine in that
box do so. Ruth might like them
for school dresses if they were
made over and brightened up with
something. My things accumulate
and I grow out of them so, they
might as well be used if possible.

I will write more when I feel
better - Don't worry about me
I'll be alright.
